

## **National Trust Heritage Walk**

Linda Roberts of the National Trust (ACT) hosted a very successful Heritage Walk on Sunday 28 July of the Pinnacle near Hawker, incorporating the old Weetangera Methodist Cemetery.

For more than 80 years the cemetery served the largely Methodist community of the Belconnen area with the church operating until 1952.

Peter Browning, the centre's family history co-ordinator, gave participants an overview of the origin of the cemetery, including a map detailing the 42 known burials.
