* John's transportation records show that he was married with three children when convicted. His family appears to have died after his transportation, as no records of them have been found and he remarried in 1833.

He was working on Joshua Moore's Canberry station in 1827, when he assisted James Ainslie in the capture of the bushranger, John Tennant and earned his ticket of leave and settled down shortly after at Gundaroo.
